This is a special class operating learning in and through te ao Māori. All subjects of our New Zealand Curriculum are taught using a Māori perspective, and where appropriate, in te reo Māori.

Whānau will need to submit this application form if they wish to choose this option for their children. It is essential that both the whānau and the child are committed to the aims and aspirations of Te Kāhui Tamariki and are prepared to support and work hard to achieve them.

If applications exceed available places in the class, a selection procedure may be necessary and unsuccessful applicants will be placed onto a waiting list.

#### Our Māori-medium bilingual programme aims to enact the goal of Māori success as Māori:

- We will support the growth and development of the Maori language.
- We will support the identity, language and culture of Māori learners and their whānau to strengthen belonging, engagement and achievement as Māori so that Māori learners can actively participate in te ao Māori, Aotearoa/New Zealand and the wider world.

#### We will do this by:

- Teaching or extending our students in and through Te Reo Māori me ona tīkanga and knowledge of Te Ao Māori.
- Working in partnership with whānau to support their child's learning and progress through regular hui and learning conferences.
- Preparing our students to succeed as Māori, ensuring the learning is based on a foundation of self knowledge and pride, allowing students to be affirmed in their identity, and to extend their cultural knowledge

Choosing to be part of Te Kāhui Tamariki means that the student and their whānau accept and uphold the aims of the programme and will actively support the kaiako and staff responsible.

#### Taking part in school Kapa Haka is a compulsory component of the programme.
